2017-18 PARENT SURVEY REPORT

About the Survey

Each year, the Etiwanda School District administers a parent survey as part of an ongoing effort to assess and improve its services to students and the community. The survey is an important means of monitoring the district's progress toward goals developed under its Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP).

The 2017-18 Parent Survey was divided into three areas aligned with LCAP goals:

- Conditions of Learning
- Pupil Outcomes
- Engagement



The survey asked parents their level of agreement with statements regarding their child's school during the 2016-17 year on topics such as school leadership, communication, instruction, and facilities. A final section asked parents to select their top choices for Parent Education Workshops. Parents were provided access to the survey online at each school site's Back-to-School Night and on the district website throughout the month of August. Online versions of the survey were available in English, Spanish, Mandarin, and Arabic.

This report summarizes the results for **Heritage Intermediate School**.
